A017CS Tractor Pull	Team of up to 8, preferably at least 3 of each gender, to pull a tractor over a set distance. The tractor is to be on hard ground and cordoned off from spectators. Stopping blocks are to be used at the end of the course. A competent person is to sit in the tractor to operate the brake as required. A tug of war rope is to be used; a marker will be tied to the rope marking the minimum distance from the tractor to the first competitor. The quickest time wins. Thick tops (or several layers) & trainers must be worn. Instruction will be given on the day. The judge's decision is final. Any unsafe behaviour will lead to disqualification of the team.
