### **GENERAL RULES**

- Please note entries will <u>only</u> be accepted on the digital competition entry form and must be submitted to the County Office by the set date.
- 2. Clubs may enter the total number of entrants, please note that competitors over the age of 28 will not be able to compete at Eastern Area and National competitions and that only one entry will count towards points.
- 3. Provided a club has already submitted their current block entry, they may request to the Competitions & Training Committee (CAT) Chairman a late entry into competitions for that block. Acceptance of a late entry is at the discretion of the CAT Chairman and Vice-Chairman and will not be permitted where this will detrimentally affect the running of the competition.
- 4. Change of entries will **NOT** be accepted later than 3 working days prior to a weekend competition, and 5 working days for a weekday/evening competition; changes on the day may lead to disqualification. Late withdrawals from any competition, changes on the day or lack of attendance will issue a £40.00 fine which will be invoiced to the club, this will be reduced to £20.00 if paid within 7 days. **No show or Late Withdrawal from any competition will also result in 3 marks being deducted from the NFU Trophy score of the Club.**
- 5. All competition rules will be strictly enforced and if any Clubs are found to be in default after an event, their results will be discounted and any NFU Cup Points gained will be deducted. Clubs are asked to be particularly aware of the age qualifications for competitors in each individual competition. These are clearly laid down in each set of both County and National

- rules. If you require clarification of any rules please refer to the CAT Chairman, Vice-Chairman or the YFC Office. National rules and guidelines will be in place for all National competitions.
- 6. COMPETITORS MUST BE REGISTERED MEMBERS. Members must produce a digital membership card with a photograph. Where a membership card cannot be shown digitally it must be printed. If no card is presented (either digital or printed) then the member will not be allowed to compete.
- 7. Insurance. The cover provided by the National YFC Insurance Scheme will apply to all Clubs and members participating in any of these competitions. Any queries regarding Insurance, contact the County Office in the first instance. Non-members competing where not agreed prior to the competition with the County Office will invalidate the competition's insurance for the entire day.
- 8. If, at the time of the competition day, a club holds an overdue invoice owed to Norfolk FYFC the club will not be able to compete until the invoice is paid in full. This is in line to the Constitution.
- 9. Selection of competitors for Eastern Area/National Competitions will be organised on competition days if possible.
- 10. If there are not enough entries received for any individual competition, the competition will not take place.
- II. A "SCRATCH TEAM" is permitted. The team cannot be placed but will gain I point for entering.

COUNTRYSIDER Member must be 10 – 16 as at 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023

Countrysiders cannot join until their 10<sup>th</sup> birthday

JUNIOR Member must be 10 – 16 as at 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023

# **Cube Exhibit**

Rules: National YFC rules to be adhered to, rules are available to download from the members area at, www.norfolkyfc.co.uk An Exhibit to depict the theme of a Country of your choice.

The Club Team is required to exhibit 5 crafts. 1 craft from each of the headings below:

- •Craft 1 Floral Art (Any item using cut flowers and accessories in a suitable container)
- •Craft 2 Cookery/Baking (This craft will be tasted so must be covered with cling film)
- •Craft 3 Textile Handicraft (Must include British Wool, knitwear, embroidery or tapestry for example)
- •Craft 4 Natural Handicraft (Any item using wood, metal, clay, glass, stone or shell for example)
- •Craft 5 Art (An item that could include photography, a graphic or a picture in any medium)

The five (5) crafts need to be clearly marked 1-5 together with the heading the craft comes under. For example 1- Floral Art, 2 – Cookery, 3- Sewn Handicraft, 4-Natural Handicraft, 5- Art Handicraft.

Each whole Exhibit to have a MAXIMUM WIDTH of 1 metre at any given point and a MAXIMUM DEPTH of 1 metre and MAXIMUM HEIGHT of 1 metre. Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the external walls of the exhibit. Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the external walls of the cube will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit. The external walls will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit. The exhibit must have 3 walls.

1. **DATE & VENUE** – Venue to be Spa Centre, Leamington Spa on either Saturday, 20<sup>th</sup> or Sunday, 21<sup>st</sup> April 2024 and the results will be given during the Drama Competition Finals.

### 2. REPRESENTATION

- 2.1. Counties may enter one competitor per 600 members or part thereof in Area Eliminators.
- 2.2. Areas will be represented by **one** competitor in the Final competition.
- 2.3. Member of the Year competitors are eligible to compete in a second NFYFC final on the same day if applicable.

### 3. **ELIGIBILITY**

- 3.1. The competitor must be 18 years or over and 28 years or under on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023 and a full member of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC.
- 3.2. If the competitor through to the National Final must withdraw from the competition, then the next highest placed competitor will represent the Area.
- 3.3. All substitutes must have been eligible to compete in the County Final.

### 4. PROCEDURE

- 4.1. **PART 1:** 28 DAYS prior to the National Final competitors will be required to submit to the Competitions Department at NFYFC a completed synopsis form (attached) to be no more than **2 sides of A4**, detailing their YFC activities. It is recommended that this form be used at County and Area level. (Special emphasis should be placed on their involvement at Club level).
- 4.2. **PART 2:** Competitors will be interviewed by a panel of Judges. The interview will be formal, but will be in a supportive atmosphere with the opportunity for competitors to demonstrate why they should be Senior Member of the Year; prior to the Performing Arts competition.
- 4.3. **PART 3:** Competitors will be required to attend the Drama Final during which they will be asked two questions on stage, one previously asked in the interview stage, and another based on the competitor's contribution to the YFC movement.
- 4.4. **PART 4**: Results and Presentation of Awards will be made during the Drama Competition Finals.

### 5. **OBJECTIVES**

5.1. The objective of the competition is to select a member who has shown that they are involved in all aspects of the YFC Movement and who can be an ambassador for YFC. Judges will be looking for:

- Involvement at Club level throughout the period of membership
- Overall YFC involvement (i.e., Club, County, Area or National)
- Specific involvement in activities in the previous 12 months (environment conservation, competitions, recruitment, programming, charity, sport, club officer)
- General commitment to YFC awareness of other members' interests in YFC and objective view of the future of the organisation
- Knowledge of the YFC movement at Club, County, Area and National levels and to share that knowledge over the 12-month period following the final

### 1. DATE AND VENUE

1.1. After Area Finals, the National Final will be held on Competitions Day, Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2024 at Staffordshire Showground.

### 2. REPRESENTATION

- 2.1. Counties may enter one team per 600 members or part thereof in Area Finals.
- 2.2. Areas will be represented in the final by one team per 3,000 members or part thereof. (Northern Area 2, Eastern Area 1 and East Midlands 1, West Midlands Area 1, South West Area 2, South East Area 1 and Wales 2)

### 3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1. A team shall consist of 4 members, each of whom must be 21 years of age or under on 1 September 2023 and full members of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC.

### 4. SUBSTITUTION

4.1. All substitutes must have been eligible to compete in the County Final.

### 5. **PROCEDURE**

- 5.1. The team shall consist of a Chairman and a panel of three members. Draw for order of appearance will be made prior to the day. All competitors must be present 20 minutes before going onto the platform; the Chairman will be given a choice of sealed envelopes. One will be chosen which will contain six question topics, three of a general knowledge and three on rural affairs, from which he/she will select three for discussion by the team. One question must be selected from each section plus one other. The Chairman will have no prior communication with the team about the questions he/she has selected to be discussed. *No written communication on the topics to be discussed may be given to the Panel or any use of a mobile phone at any time*. The penalty will be automatic disqualification.
- 5.2. The Chairman will be responsible for introducing the panel to the audience, putting each question to the panel, summarising their answers, concluding the meeting, timing, control of the panel and coverage of each question.
- 5.3. The competition should be treated as a formal meeting.
- 5.4. Competitors may make their own notes FOR REFERENCE on the platform, but excessive and obvious use of notes will be penalised. No other reference books or papers may be used while on the platform.
- 5.5. Teams will be penalised for using distasteful jokes or bad language. - 5.3. The five (5) crafts need to be clearly marked 1-5 together with the heading the craft comes under. For example 1- Floral Art, 2 Cookery, 3- Textile Handicraft, 4- Natural Handicraft, 5- Art Handicraft.

- 5.5. At the NFYFC final, the NFYFC will provide a County Name and Number label for each display and workspace.
- 5.6. Competitors may use a battery-operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will no mains power supply available
- 5.7. Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the back board or base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the back board or base board will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit and should be within the size restrictions. The external side of the back board will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit.
- 5.8. Exhibits must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. Any entry removed before the Presentation of Awards will be disqualified.
- 5.9. All exhibits and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and NFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

### 6. **TIMING**

- 6.0. Allowance of **one hour to include final checks and measurement of the exhibit**. Before leaving the competing area, competitors will be given a further 5 minutes to clear and tidy the work site.
- 6.1. Competitors may unpack their equipment and plant material/flowers onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session commences.
- 6.2. No floral foam is allowed Eco friendly alternatives **MUST** be used. See the NAFAS Guide to Mechanics for ideas on alternative methods to use.
- 6.3. Competitors may set up their Eco-friendly flower arranging support material/mechanics in position prior to the one-hour practical session if required.
- 6.4. Competitors are able to set up their display bay before the one-hour practical session commences.

### 7. MARKS

If a very high number of entries are received, on the day of the NFYFC final, the NFYFC reserves the right to use the NFYFC 'Standards Judging' system. i.e exhibits will be in the Excellent, Proficient or Competent categories.

### 8. AWARDS

- 8.0. 16 & under Lady Northcliffe Cup and Prize Card will be awarded to competitors placed 1st
- 8.1. 21 & under Millers' Mutual Cup and Prize Card will be awarded to competitors placed 1st
- 8.2. **26 & under** *London Flowers Perpetual Challenge Trophy* and Prize Card will be awarded to competitors placed 1<sup>st</sup>
- 8.3. NFYFC Prize Cards will be awarded to competitors placed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in each section.
- 8.4. NFYFC Certificate of Achievement will be awarded to competitors placed  $1^{st} 10^{th}$  in each section.

### 9. **NOTES:**

- 9.0. Competitors to note that all buckets will be checked by Stewards on arrival for pre-arranged foliage
- 9.1. Competitors must not bring photographs/diagrams of previously arranged Floral Exhibits into the competing arena. Any competitor found doing so may be disqualified.
- 9.2. Competitors must wear white coats during the period of the competition. Club, County and Sponsor logos are permitted on either the front or the back of the coats.
- 9.3. A "Competitions Manual" is available from NAFAS Enterprises Ltd. <u>www.nafas.org.uk</u>
- 9.4. ALL EXHIBITS WILL BE JUDGED STRICTLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NAFAS COMPETITIONS MANUAL 2023. A "Competitions Manual" is available from <a href="https://www.nafas.org.uk">www.nafas.org.uk</a> to visit the NAFAS on-line shop.
- 10. **NAFAS Definitions** (The National Association of Flower Arranging Societies of Great Britain) From the NAFAS Competitions Manual (Fourth Edition 2023).
  - 10.0. An EXHIBIT:
    - 10.0.1.Is composed of natural plant material in all its forms, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.
    - 10.0.2. Accessories need to go in front of backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit, unless otherwise stated.
    - 10.0.3. More than one placement may always be included, unless otherwise stated.
    - 10.0.4.In all exhibits natural plant material must predominate. Plant material must now predominate in all Still Life Exhibits

### 10.1. NATURAL PLANT MATERIAL

- 10.1.1.Natural plant material is any vegetable matter
- 10.1.2.It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, foliage, fungi, vegetables and seaweed or made-up plant material.
- 10.1.3.It is acceptable to enhance plant material by the application of oil, milk, wax, leaf shine or other similar products.

### 10.2. ARTIFICAL PLANT MATERIAL

- 10.2.1.Artificial plant material is realistic or fantasy plant-forms, made wholly or partly from non-plant material.

  This includes, clay, glass, metal, plastic, plaster, polyester, shells, silk, wax, etc. This also includes fabric and ribbon made from a non-plant source, which is used as a substitute for natural plant material in an exhibit.
- 10.2.2. Artificial plant material **is not allowed** unless specifically permitted in a show schedule (see reasons for disqualification).
- 10.2.3. Artificial plant material or artificial plant forms that are an integral part of a container, base, background or accessory are permitted.
- 10.2.4. Artificial grass turf must not be used for any purpose including bases.

### 10.3. An ACCESSORY

- 10.3.1.Anything other than natural plant material in an exhibit, such as, feathers, shells, stones, wax candles
- 10.3.2. The following are not accessories and may also be used unless prohibited by the show schedule: backgrounds, bases, containers holding plant material, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics. These may be

decorated in any way but greater credit should be given for use of natural plant material where appropriate.

### 10.4. REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

- 10.4.1. Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, i.e. the measurements or the components. (Just remember it is better to aim to be at least several cms smaller than the size allowed as the size stated is the MAXIMUM size).
- 10.4.2.Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule)
- 10.4.3.Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material. Exceptions: Air Plants, Cacti, Fruits, Grass Turf, Lichen, Moss, Succulents, Vegetables and long lasting plant material which will remain turgid for the duration of a show. (Definition of turgid the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

**NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE DISQUALIFICATION:** the term used when an exhibit does not comply with the requirements of the schedule – see NAFAS reasons for disqualification above. The judge will write 'Not according to schedule' and the reason.
